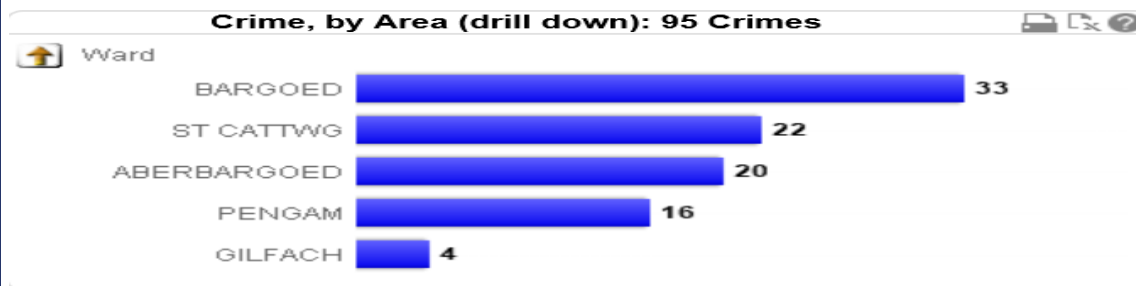

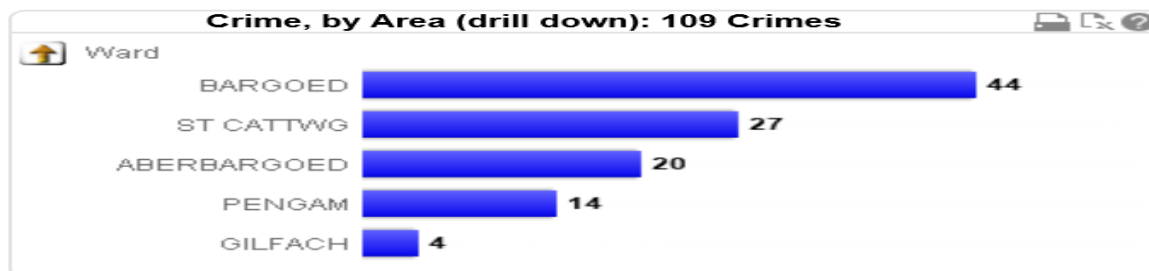
Overview of Reported Crimes

Total of 204 crimes since our last meeting. Average crime figures for the area.

We have experienced a further reduction in ASB related calls.

22 ASB (Nuisance) related calls between 14.12.22 and 22.01.23

- Aberbargoed = 10
- Bargoed = 9
- St Cattwgs = 2
- Pengam = 1

Incidents of note since last Council Meeting

- Officers attended reports of ASB in December at ASB at Ty cornel flats. Persons involved have been identified by local officers and action taken with the Anti -Social Behaviour process.
- We responded to some theft of fuel incidents at Morrisons, Bargoed during the build up to Christmas, drivers have been identified and dealt with.
- 14.12.22 Officers attend a report of ASB at Morrisons – officers attended swiftly and the youths were identified. ASB referrals have now been submitted for both youths and staff at Morrisons have been updated.
- 09.01.23 - Commercial burglary at one of the Units at Bowen Ind. Estate, 3 Mountain Bikes stolen, unfortunately not yet recovered.
- The team have been responding to some reports of anti-social behaviour at Aberbargoed Library .ASB referrals have been progressed and our CSO`s have since visited their home addresses and advised them in their presence of parents.
- Officers dealt with a disorder call at Park View Bargoed, we received an allegation of a number of assaults and a male person was arrested. This investigation continues
- Currently monitoring an incident involving a suspicious male on 19.01.23 at Heol Cae Derwen, Gilfach Estate. This has been publicised on Social Media but we are dealing with it as an isolated incident at this time.

‘Your Voice’ updates

No further issues with fire lighting in the area of Aberbargoed and issues of ASB around the flats have decreased following submission of a number of ASB and follow up action with the identified youths and parents/guardians.

Week of Action 10th to 17th December Road Traffic Operation

Team Assisted with LPA Road Traffic Operation in Bargoed

- 285 Vehicles were stopped & checked
- 162 persons breathalysed
- 3 Persons arrested for Drink/Drug driving
- 6 Persons reported for minor traffic offences
- 4 Vehicles seized for being driven without valid insurance

The Joint engagement event which included a Handmade Sleigh crafted by members of Aberbargoed Fire Station, Meet and Greet with Santa with selection boxes handed to every child in attendance. There was also a show and tell opportunity within the fire appliance and Police Public order vehicle during which the children and families had opportunities to have an insight into what the police riot vans/fire appliances looked like inside, the equipment held within them, the role of officer and Fire Crew (as well as photo opportunities with officers holding some police riot equipment).

Events were held across the area including Bargoed Park, Gilfach Bowls club, Aberbargoed Hanger, Gelligaer Square, New Tredegar, Ystrad Mynach and areas in Blackwood also.
