

As our construction and transformation efforts shift focus to the Rhymney and Cardiff Bay lines, we'd like to provide you with an update on the upcoming work we need to undertake to deliver Metro on the Rhymney Line.

As per our current work to the Coryton > Caerphilly line, the work will mean short-term disruptions to rail services, road closures and night-time engineering work across the line. This will enable us to electrify the railway line, carry out upgrades to our railway stations to make them more accessible and carry out essential railway maintenance.

The core benefits of the Metro project will be delivered through a series of key steps, taking place incrementally until 2027. This approach allows TfW to consistently deliver benefits to customers over the coming two years without introducing significant changes all at once, which could negatively impact service performance.

We will be hosting a **virtual Local Authority Open Event on 05 March, 14:30 – 16:30**. This will be an opportunity to hear from our leads from each package of works and to ask any questions ahead of the works starting.

Due to the significant number of potential attendees and to ensure everyone has the opportunity for questions, we would request that a maximum of 2 representatives per Community Council attend. Following the open event, should the Community Council have further questions, we can look to arrange a session with all members of the committee.
